

HD check in PawPeds health programme

Talk to your regular veterinarian and make an appointment for X-raying the hips and - unless it has already been done - to microchip or tattoo the cat for a permanent ID.

Before you go to your appointment, you should however download the form and information from the health programme. It is important that you have the latest version of the form, so that your veterinarian will know where to send the form to together with the X-rays. The form is attached in this document. Please, download a fresh copy every time so that you are sure to always use the latest version!

The cat should be no younger than 10 months for an official result in the registry of the health programme. Preliminary evaluations can be done from 6 months of age. Preliminary results will be registered in the health programme with a note saying it is a preliminary result.

NOTE! The cat must have a permanent ID (microchip or tattoo).

Even though the health programme was originally set up for Maine Coons, cats of any breed are welcome to participate. We have the same fee and rules regardless of the breed.

If you want an X-ray picture for your own files, you should really ask your veterinarian to make an extra one, because those sent in to the health programme for evaluation will be kept in an archive by the health programme, for future reference and research. X-rays that have been sent in will not be returned.

If digital X-ray is used each examined cat should be on an individual CD.

Before you go to your veterinarian for the X-ray, you should fill in the fields in the frame on the form with the headline "To be filled in by the owner". Do not forget to sign at the bottom of this frame! It is **not** optional to sign. If you do not want to participate in the health programme or you do not accept the terms, you should neither use the form of the health programme nor send X-rays to us for evaluation.

The fee for the evaluation should be paid in advance to PawPeds' account. Please, include the cat's name and that it is an HD payment in the message text on the payment! A reminder for a missing payment will be sent out immediately when the result has arrived to PawPeds' registrar (see fee below).

When you go to your veterinarian for the X-rays, you should bring the following with you:

- The form from the health programme, filled in and signed
- The info paper to the veterinarian
- The pedigree certificate of the cat
- If the ID number is not mentioned on the pedigree certificate, you must also bring the official ID registration depending on the procedure used in your country or cat club.

Your veterinarian should then send the X-rays and the form to the Swedish specialist Dr. Per Eksell. His address is printed on the form.

Information to the veterinary who is to X-ray the cat

PawPeds is an organisation working for better and healthier animal breeding. The health programme against hip dysplasia was started by the Swedish breed club "Maine Coon-katten" January 1, 2000. It was taken over by PawPeds June 1, 2010. Even though the health programme was initially started for Maine Coon cats, cats of other breeds are just as welcome to participate in this programme.

We have a special agreement with Dr. Per Eksell, who does all the hip evaluations for us. In order to get more equal level on the ratings it is very important to have one single person who will grade the hips of all the cats in the health programme. The grading scale is well documented, since the health programme keeps all the X-rays in an archive.

Below is a short description of how the cat should be X-rayed and how the form should be used.

NOTE! The cat must have a permanent ID (microchip or tattoo).

Loose joints have been shown to occur in some cats, hence the recommendation is to not sedate the cat for the x-ray. Should it not be possible to handle the cat, then it is recommended to give the cat some medication to make it calm. The cat does not have to be anesthetized.

Regarding the positioning of the cat, the criteria are the same as for dogs: pelvis and knees should show on the picture, the legs should be parallel, and the knee cap should show in the middle of the femur, i.e. the legs should not be rotated outwards or inwards. **The cat's ID number and the date of the examination should be marked on the X-rays permanently by exposing that info into the X-ray film.** If there is room for it, it is good if the cat's name and registration number is also given on the X-rays. If you are using digital X-ray each examined cat should be stored on an individual CD. Digital images must be in **Dicom** format. Any changes will be announced in an update of this information, the latest version can be downloaded from <http://www.pawpeds.com/healthprogrammes/forms.html>.

The grading we use is based on the same criteria as for dogs, except that due to a slightly different anatomy the so called "Norberg's angle" does not work. Because of this we do not use the ABCD scale, but a scale of "normal", "grade 1", "grade 2", and "grade 3".

Please, check that the information on the pedigree/ID certificate and the actual ID number in the cat matches the information given by the owner on the form. It is also important that you check that the owner has signed the form before you start the examination. In order to get decent statistics it is important that the X-rays from all the examinations are sent in. For this reason the X-rays should always be sent in by the veterinary who made the examination.
